

Grant Writing Seminar – IP2 (ZOO 6927, sect. 4143)

Objectives: To introduce graduate students to the process of grant writing for various different types of grants.

Students are expected to attend the course each week. Grades will be based on completion of a sigma xi grant (15%), reviews of sigma xi grants (10%), completion of a mid-sized grant (15%), review of a mid-sized grant (10%), completion of a DDIG-style grant (25%), reviews of a project summary (5%) and review of a DDIG-style grant (10%), and participation in course activities (10%). Students will be allowed to miss one class, but must make arrangements with the instructor if more than one class will be missed.
